At its 50th year of studying and evaluating the relations between Judaism and Christianity in Israel, the Ecumenical Fraternity explores in *The Nathan Peter Levinson Memorial Lecture Series* the achievements of Jewish and Christian relations in Israel.

The third lecture examines the research of Christian and Jewish academics in rendering the Hebrew Bible into languages that lack vernacular renditions. For more than two decades, the Center for Bible Translators and the Hebrew University collaborate in that endeavor. The efforts result in putting new trends of translating the Hebrew Bible into motion. A huge number of African and Asian languages which are currently still without the Bible profit from those developments. Recently, such an approach included even a curriculum for blind Bible translators.

Dr. Halvor Ronning, together with his translator wife Mirja, is the co-founder and co-director of the Center for Bible Translators which began in 1995. Dr. Ronning is a known scholar in the Hebraic background of the Gospels and an active member of the Jerusalem School of the Synoptic Gospels.
