Mishnah and LXX as Mystery: An Example of Jewish-Christian Polemic in the Byzantine Period

This seminar continues the Fraternity's Jewish Studies Series, in cooperation with the CCEJ-Ratisbonne, on examining texts from the Jewish tradition in view of Christian contexts.

The presentation will explore a Rabbinic-Patristic debate from the Byzantine Period about whether it is the Jews or the Christians who possess God's "mystery". According to the Jewish position this divine teaching is preserved in the Oral Torah, handed down by word of mouth from the time of Moses to his Rabbinic successors. While according to the Christian position, this secret revelation is incorporated in the Septuagint, which became the "Bible of the Gentiles". Both sides of the debate presuppose that whoever processes this divine mystery may claim to be the "true Israel".

We are grateful to Professor Bregman, a – long-standing friend of the Fraternity for teaching this class.
