The Fraternity in Jerusalem seems to be placed in the middle of the world, on the receiving end of the diverse reactions to the horrific terror attack in New York: There are those in America who prepare endless funerals for 6000 people, being exhausted both emotionally and physically yet caring for each other in the most tender way; there are those in Europe organizing peace conferences with their fellow Muslim citizens in order to show solidarity with Islam, and there are those in the East who hardly conceal their satisfaction about the events. It is in this time of turmoil that we find consolation in the words of John 14: Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid.

The Fraternity Series 2001/2002

This academic year our topic is: "Communal Identity and Diversity in Judaism and Christianity. Faces of Religious Communities in Jerusalem". The opening lecture on October 25 will be given by Mr. Yossi Klein-HaLevi, a researcher on Christian and Jewish communities in Israel by giving an "objective" photograph of these groups. It is also the occasion of launching his new book published in September 2001, *At the Entrance to the Garden of Eden* (New York: Morrow, 2001).

The Fraternity Sick Fund

In response to both requests for help and offers of support, the Fraternity has decided to officialize her service to the local Christians with serious health needs. Despina (Marphlan's Syndrome) & Shadi (Cystic Fibrosis) are just two of the young patients that have been helped so far. Several more are on the waiting list, including: A young father who has already lost sight in one eye and is about to lose the other as well; A schoolboy with advanced diabetes, desperately in need of regular injections of insulin that are not easily obtained in his town of residence. In her strategic position in Jerusalem, the Fraternity is blessed to offer this help whenever possible.

Prayers for Peace

A joint initiative by the Patriarchs and Heads of Churches, Communities & Institutions in Jerusalem: A Call to Prayer during the week of August 15-28. A New Greek Orthodox Patriarch

On Saturday September 15th we joined the solemn ceremony for the enthronement of the new Greek Orthodox Patriarch, His Beatitude Irineos at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. The new Patriarch arrived in Jerusalem for the first time in 1953 where he has served as a Monk, Senior Deacon, Priest, Archimandrite and Deputy Sacristan. Since 1981 he has been Archbishop of Hierapolis and in 1994 he was named a Metropolitan.
