Dear Friends,

At the end of the year 2001 we recognize that the seemingly overwhelming discontinuity in our Christian presence in Jerusalem is in fact of less impact than that of the elements of continuity. On the one hand, many institutions dedicated to Jewish-Christian relations and the study of Judaism have been muted, with personnel changes in its wake. These elements of discontinuity are still showing their effects. In this atmosphere of instability, we are grateful to say that on the other hand, the Fraternity continues to be widely-supported and continuing strongly according to its vocation. We are thankful for all the encouragement and tangible support for both the academic and endeavours given to the Fraternity during the last year. We hope that in the coming year, the Fraternity will be able to continue to give guidance in the ecumenical scene both in and from Jerusalem.

ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

The Fraternity Series 2001/2002

The holiday season lecture on December 20 was given by Prof. Pesach Schindler: "Fatal Theologies that Misshaped Community: Restoration of Zion as a Response to the Holocaust." Prof. Schindler, a senior professor at the Hebrew University, has done extensive research for his book entitled Yissakhar Shlomo Teichthal: EmHabanim Semehah; Restoration of Zion as a Response During the Holocaust (Hoboken: KTAV, 2001). The martyred Rabbi Teichtal composed Em Habanim Semehah in hiding during the early 1940s in Budapest. It broke with ultra-Orthodox anti-Zionist theology and argued for the legitimacy of a more active involvement with the process of redemption. The evening's question: Was this an inspiration for shaping Jewish communal identity today?

*Rev. Petra Heldt was invited to give a lecture with the title "Concepts of Identity in Early Patristic Exegesis" at the Swedish Theological Institute on Thursday December 6.

*At the Mishkenot Sha'ananim on December 20: Rabbi Ehud Bandel (President of the Masorti Movement in Israel) and Prof. Mustapha Abu-Sway (Al-Quds University) engaged in dialogue on the topic, "Jihad and War of Obligation: When is War Justified?"
