Preparing the Second Vatican Council, Pope John XXIII commissioned the Head of the Secretariat for Christian Unity, Cardinal Bea, to write a document which was then called *De Judaeis*. From the beginning of this process, Cardinal Bea was in contact with Jews. During the entire period of developing of what became paragraph 4 of *Nostra Aetate*, Jewish organizations and individuals were in contact, often clandestinely, with the Secretariat of Cardinal Bea.

The lecture will present that page of the history of the Second Vatican Council and ask to which extent those contacts have influenced the final text of *Nostra Aetate*.

Dr Therese Andrevon Gottstein received her Doctorate in Theology both from the Institut Catholique de Paris and the University of Leuven for a study on *Nostra Aetate and the New Theology of the Catholic Church After Nostra Aetate. Paragraph 4 and Its Challenges.* Dr Gottstein is a member of the Elijah Interfaith Institute.
